

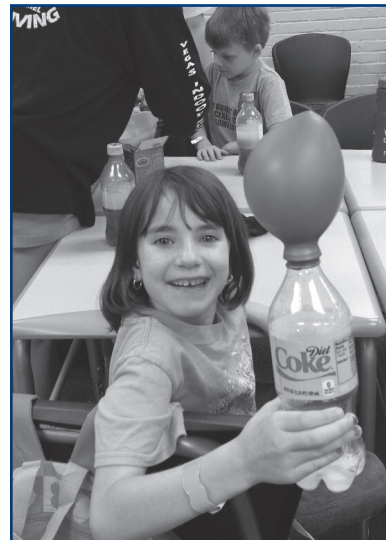

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

TRANSPORTATION — Parents (or other adults designated by parent) are responsible for drop off and pick-up for children. Parents may drop-off their children as early as 7:00 a.m. and must pick up their children no later than 5:30 p.m. from the Kids' College Headquarters, Building 96.

CANCELLATION — All Kids' College courses are self-supporting and must have a minimum number of students in order for courses to meet. The College reserves the right to cancel any class that does not meet the minimum enrollment requirements.

REGISTRATION FEES — Course prices vary by session.

- **Premier Camps** — each course costs \$158. If your child attends all day, the one week session cost is \$316. (May 30–June 2, June 5–9 and June 12–16) See back cover.
- **Theatre Camp** — 8 a.m.–4:45 p.m. for 4 days; \$140. Age 8–12 only (May 30–June 2)
- **Sports & Games Camp** — each course costs \$58. If your child attends all day, the one-week session cost is \$116. (July 31–August 4)
- **"Mini" Camp** — each course costs \$58. If your child attends all day, the session cost is \$116 for 3 days. (August 7–9)
- **Session 1** — each course costs \$58. If your child attends all day, the one-week session cost is \$116. (June 5–9) Premier courses are \$158. See Premier Camps above.
- **Session 2** — each course costs \$58. If your child attends all day, the one-week session cost is \$116. (June 12–16) Premier courses are \$158.

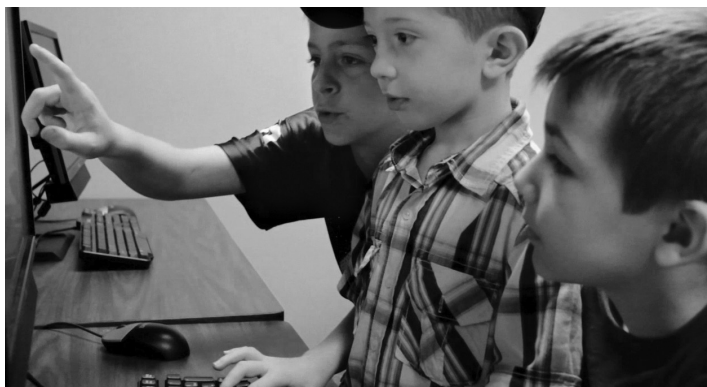

Bit O' Spanish: Students will become familiar with Spanish language and culture through various activities including playing games and singing songs. They will learn about Spanish traditions, food, and significant events.

Bowling /Soccer: Learn the basics of bowling including form, rules, scoring, and etiquette. Weekly field trips to Cordova Lanes. Learn soccer fundamentals in a fun and enjoyable atmosphere.

Brain Games: Help increase creative thinking, vocabulary and math skills through word games, intriguing puzzles and math games.

Comic Book Characters: Read comic books, make a comic book page, and act out comic book characters. Students will explore topics about superheroes/villains and what characters classify them.

Cool Science: Explore the fun aspects of science through group discussions and various hands-on experiments.
