Requirements to Participate

1. Complete the Check-out and Emergency Form.*
2. Complete the Acceptable Behavior Standard Agreement.*
3. Register and pay for classes Online at www.pensacolastate.edu/ce or on any campus; or by mail.
4. Register your child based on their age during program.
5. Bring or purchase lunch if child attends full day of classes.

Suggestions for Success

1. Children should wear comfortable play clothes that are easily cleaned.
2. Talk with your child about safety issues.
3. If this is your child's first experience at Pensacola State College, we suggest that you visit the campus before the classes start.
4. Give your child a written list of their classes.

- Kids' College is from 8 a.m.–4:45 p.m. each day in separate age groupings. Choose one course in each time slot. Drop off 7–8 a.m. and pick up by 5:30 p.m. (no extra fee).
- A minimum enrollment requirement is needed in order for class to make.
- Class enrollment will be limited to insure quality of instruction.
- Parents will need to come into Building 96 to sign students in and out of Kids' College.
- Anyone picking up child must present a picture I.D. in order to sign out any students.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

TRANSPORTATION: Parents (or other adults designated by parent) are responsible for drop off and pick-up for children. Parents may drop-off their children as early as 7:00 a.m. and must pick up their children no later than 5:30 p.m. from the Kids' College Headquarters, Building 96.

CANCELLATION: All Kids' College courses are self-supporting and must have a minimum number of students in order for courses to meet. The College reserves the right to cancel any class that does not meet the minimum enrollment requirements.

REGISTRATION FEES: Course prices vary by session.

- **Theatre Camp:** 8 a.m.–4:45 p.m. for 4 days; \$140. Ages 8–12 only (May 29–June 1)
- **Premier Camps:** each course costs \$158. If your child attends all day, the one-week session cost is \$316. (June 4–8, June 11–15 and June 18–22) See back cover.
- **Art Specialty Camp:** each course costs \$58. If your child attends all day, the one-week session cost is \$116. (July 30–Aug. 3 & Aug. 6–10)
- **Sports & Games Camp:** each course costs \$58. If your child attends all day, the one-week session cost is \$116. (July 30–Aug. 3)
- **Session 1:** each course costs \$58. If your child attends all day, the one-week session cost is \$116. (June 4–8) Premier courses are \$158. See Premier Camps above.
- **Session 2:** each course costs \$58. If your child attends all day, the one-week session cost is \$116. (June 11–15) Premier courses are \$158.
- **Session 3:** each course costs \$58. If your child attends all day, the one-week session cost is \$116. (June 18–22) Premier courses are \$158.
- **Session 4:** each course costs \$58. If your child attends all day, the two-week session cost is \$232. (June 25–July 6) Kids College will be closed on Wednesday, July 4.

- **Session 5:** each course costs \$58. If your child attends all day, the two-week session cost is \$232. (July 9–20)
- **Session 6:** each course costs \$29. If your child attends all day, the one-week session cost is \$116. (July 23–27)

AGE: Students must be at least 6 years old to enroll and must have attended Kindergarten. All students must be between 6 and 12 years of age during the dates of the program.

LUNCH BREAK: Plan to bring or purchase lunch each full day of classes. Supervised lunch will be from 11:45 a.m. until 12:45 p.m. each day. Students can purchase a lunch at a nominal fee from Subway. Orders and payments need to be placed online at www.subway.com the night before or in the morning by 9 a.m. each day. **USE CHILD'S NAME!** Subway lunches will be ready for students when they arrive in the Student Center, 1000 College Blvd., bldg. 5. **Please put name on any containers your child carries. NOTE: Subway is not available here on Fridays.**

SNACKS: Students are encouraged to bring snacks and bottled water. They need them in containers that they must carry throughout the day. **Please put name on any containers your child carries.**

REFUNDS: All requests for refunds must be received in the Continuing Education Office in writing prior to the beginning of the 2nd class.

COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

Acting without Words: Learn the art of pantomime, build self-confidence and improve social skills through a variety of fun activities using this art form.

Arts and Crafts: Students will have the opportunity to build skills and practice many different formats of art, as they work on a variety of projects.

Be a Pet Vet: Teaches the importance of pet care. Parents bring selected pets for special visit on campus as part of animal activity — all pets in crates or on leash.

Be a Superhero: Discover stories about favorite superheroes, whether from the Marvel Universe, DC Universe or maybe a superhero only to that student.

Bit O' Spanish: Become familiar with Spanish language and culture through various activities including playing games and singing songs. Learn about traditions, food, and significant events.

Bowling/Soccer: Learn the basics of bowling including form, rules, scoring, and etiquette. Enjoy weekly field trips to Cordova Lanes. Learn soccer fundamentals in a fun and enjoyable atmosphere.

Bookmaking & Pop Up Cards: Create several types of fun, clever books including star, origami, flag, envelope, tunnel, accordion, paper bag... It's all in the creation! Also learn how to make all sorts of Pop Up Cards from simple (one page) cards to amazing art pieces. Let your imagination go wild!

Brain Games: Help increase creative thinking, vocabulary and math skills through word games, intriguing puzzles and math games.

Cool Science: Explore the fun aspects of science through group discussions and hands-on experiments.

Dance: Multiple styles of dance practiced.

Digital Photography: Learn basic techniques for taking digital photographs. Practice taking photos around campus. Required: Must bring own digital camera.

Ecosystem Fun: This field trip based course provides opportunities to learn about and experience the ecosystems of the Gulf Coast.

Fairytales and Legends: Discover fairytales and legends of old; have the opportunity to dress up and act out some favorite fairytales or legends.

Fashion Design: Study current fashion, historical influence on fashion and ways to create new ensembles. Fashion Show planned for end of session.

Fishing: Learn catch-and-release fishing. Includes discussions about fishing ethics, hands on activities and field trips to go fishing each Friday. Adult family members can participate by registering as a field trip observer for a one-time fee of \$5 for all field trips. (Course R04542, Section 8495)

Fun with Music: Students will begin to understand the impact music can have in their lives with simple songs and instruments. Students will also have the opportunity to make their own instruments.

Games Inside & Out: Play games together with group including a variety of board games, cup stacking, juggling, and yard games, such as Frisbee.

Grammar with a Giggle: Giggle your way through the parts of speech by being introduced to "The Lady with the Purple Eye" or "Harry The Beast" or "The Four-eyed Weirdo."

Happy Horror: Experience the thrill of cute monsters, beautiful witches, friendly bugs, and more. Activities will include stories, crafts, and games.

Interlocking Bricks: Have fun creating structures individually and in groups.

Japanese Culture: Tokyo will be the host of the 2020 Summer Olympic Games, so become familiar with Japanese language, culture, manners and geography through various activities — writing letters, using chopsticks, and possibly making sushi.

Jewelry Making: Learn how to string beads, finger weaving, and other techniques. Come with a good imagination to make some fun and attractive accessories.

Kids in the Kitchen: Students make kid-friendly recipes and practice with items such as no-bake cookies.

Kids in Media: Learn several aspects of journalism through discussions, observation and the creation of a digital magazine and news show. Interview other students, staff and adults in the community to comprise stories in multiple platforms. A website and taped show is planned.

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King Tut ARTifacts: Explore and create art based on King Tut. Cartouches, hieroglyphics, cats, mummies, jewelry and ancient Egyptian drawings are just a few of the topics. Many “ARTifacts” will be created as students dig into the life of King Tut.

Lacrosse: Enjoy learning basic skills, rules, and how to play the exciting upcoming sport of lacrosse. Skills include ball throwing and catching, rules for the boys and girls game, and positions on field.

Land Down Under — Australia: Let's go on an adventure to the Land Down Under — Australia. Discover animals, sea life, culture, literature, architecture and art of this beautiful island. Experience Aboriginal art, Uluru Rock, Sydney Opera House and the Great Barrier Reef.

Let's Be Mind: Students will incorporate yoga, mindful breathing and fun activities to improve focus and social skills. Mindfulness mitigates the effects of bullying, helps with ADHD and improves overall well-being.

Mad Scientist: Learn basic, exciting scientific concepts in a fun-filled, hands-on environment. Students will perform various experiments.

Making Monsters: Use different art materials to make cute 3-dimensional and 1-dimensional monsters.

Martial Arts Mania: This comprehensive program teaches self-defense, self-confidence, physical fitness, and mental discipline in a non-competitive, safety-oriented class.

Math Games: Play games utilizing dice, cards, dominos and math bingo. Review basic math through hands-on activities. Tell time, read temperatures, use weights and measures and count money.

Math in Motion: Students will learn Geometry using various dance and movement techniques.

Modeling: Learn how to model your own outfits to various scenes set to music. There will be a show at the end where each student will model the outfits he or she has chosen for five scenes.

Movie Making: Write and star in your own movie which will be available to share with others.

Newspaper Reporting: Produce a “Kids' College Newspaper.” Interview fellow students in other classes, create stories, type them in computer lab, then reproduce and distribute copies.

Paper Sculptures: Create high relief paper sculptures.

Plants for Fun & Food: Explore edible plants and learn delicious ways of eating them. Activities include stories, crafts and games.

Pottery and Crafts: Explore the creative possibilities of clay and other materials to produce finished works of art using modeling clay, paper, fabric, various objects, paint and more.

Print Making: Learn the art of embossing and ink transfers to create greeting cards and original prints.

Recycled Dresses: Come have fun making fashionable dresses out of newspapers and magazine ads. Use your creativity to design your own dress with all the fun beads, sequins and accessories you can find. Class will include fashion show at the end of the week.

Space Camp: Investigate the last frontier — space. Learn about the planets, constellations, individual stars and more! Space travel will be explored.

Space Exploration: Learn about the planet, galaxies, stars and much more. Field trip to college Planetarium is planned.

Sports and Games: Try a variety of games and sports including basketball, golf, baseball, flag-football, softball, Frisbee, badminton, horseshoes, boundary ball, and more.

Sports Exploration: Explore the world of sports; try a variety of sports then learn about their origin, rules and ways to play as a team and as individuals.

Sports Explorers: Try a variety of sports from countries around the world—a different approach to sports.

Sports Sampler: Try a variety of sports including basketball, golf, baseball, flag-football, softball, Frisbee, badminton, horseshoes, boundary ball and more.

Stage/Theatre: Introduces simple stage and theatre production techniques. There will be a show at the end of the class for parents and friends to view.

Swimming: Receive both classroom as well as water instruction. Learn basic water safety and proper swim strokes. Bring swimsuit and towel each day.

Tennis: Develop tennis skills and learn proper tennis etiquette. Fitness is promoted through the fun of learning and practicing skills of the sport.

Travel Fun: Take a fun journey around the United States and the world. Activities will include stories, crafts and games.

TV Commercials: Learn to plan, write, and produce TV Commercials.

Visual Storytelling: Explore different ways to tell stories and create characters through drawing, painting and building illustrations.

Weaving: Experience styles of weaving from abstract to traditional, including Kumihimo from Japan. Use various looms, techniques, paints, recyclables, yarns, found objects and tons of textures to Zen our way through weaving!

Web-Page Design: Students will learn how to create amazing web pages using different kinds of fonts, pictures, backgrounds and lots of other page attributes. Advanced objects like tables, links and frames will be used as well.
