

## CAREER PATHWAYS ARTICULATION Surgical Technology – SURG-VC

The Nursing Department at Pensacola State College has recommended that students who complete the <a href="https://doi.org/10.2016/nc.2

To best prepare themselves for the Surgical Technology program at Pensacola State, high school students are advised to:

- 1) Achieve 2.5 GPA for high school graduation
- 2) Earn 2.75 (with no grade lower than a "B") for all Health/Science courses in their Career Academy program of study. Those courses are:

Health Science I,
Health Science II
and either
Nursing Assistant 3 or Allied Health Assisting 3

Credits to be awarded based on the successful completion of above for the SURGICAL TECHNOLOGY – VOCATIONAL CERTIFICATE are:

## 2. Student Eligibility

- To be eligible for articulated credit, students must meet all of the college requirements necessary for admission to Pensacola State College including submission of an official high school transcript.
- Students must have submitted an Application for Health Science Program and identified the Surgical Technology program as their major. All applications and forms are available at:

• It is essential that applicants to the Surgical Technology program have a thorough understanding of the requirements for entrance and progression in the Surgical Technology program. Complete and up-to-date information is available in the program packet, which is available on-line at:

- Upon acceptance to Pensacola State College, a student will be eligible to request articulated credit under the terms stated within this agreement.
- After completion of 12 credit hours at the college, the credits awarded under this
  agreement will appear on the student's transcript. Students should have reached the
  status of 'candidate" for the Surgical Technology Program within two years of high
  school graduation in order for the articulated credit to be of maximum benefit.
