**911 Public Safety Telecommunicator Program
(911 Emergency Dispatcher)**

Program Information Packet

The purpose of this program is to prepare students for the state certification exam and employment as a 911 emergency dispatcher (Public Safety Telecommunicator) for police, fire, and Emergency Medical Services. Content includes ethics; role of the telecommunicator; standard operating procedures; relationship to field personnel; command levels; message center layouts; performance aids; overview of emergency agencies; functions and terminology; use of correct words and grammar; types of communications equipment, functions and terminology; malfunctions and maintenance agreements; proper, correct telephone and dispatching procedures and techniques; cooperation and reciprocal agreements with other agencies; communication rules (federal, state, local); emergency situations and operating procedures; emergency medical dispatch procedures; leadership and human relations skills; and health/ safety including CPR.

Class Schedule

This is a one semester program with starts in August (fall) or as needed. Please apply early, as acceptance is based on a first completed, first seated standard. You will be notified when a seat is available for you, so it is important that you keep us informed of any changes to your contact information.

Course hours are set by the Florida Department of Health and the Florida Department of Education. Attendance is strictly enforced. You cannot miss several classes and still complete the course. Please plan ahead accordingly.

Each class will include lecture, lab and work at dispatch centers in Escambia and Santa Rosa counties. In addition, occasional weekend class dates will be required. Weekend dates will be announced at the beginning of the program.

The program is designed to continue for 16 weeks. Actual time may vary, based upon the college calendar.

Application Process:

It is your responsibility to make sure all requirements are on file in the Health Admissions Office in Building 3600 on the Warrington Campus. Please apply as early as possible. It will take some time to receive and post transcripts, for example. It is to your advantage to contact Health Admissions (484-2210) to ensure your file is complete.

How to apply:

Apply to Pensacola State College. Do this online at www.pensacolastate.edu. Click on quick links, then applications and forms. If this is your first application to Pensacola State College, there is a \$30 application fee. Complete "Request for Transcript" forms for your high school and every college you have attended, and mail to each school or college. These forms are also available online, under Quick Links.

1. If you have attended Pensacola State College before, but it has been over one year, you must complete the online application to update your file. There is no fee to do this.
2. Make sure all official transcripts are ordered.
3. Complete the Health-related application, at the back of this information packet. This form must be mailed or brought to the Health Admissions office on Warrington Campus. There is no fee for this application. Be sure to check "911 Public Safety Telecommunicator (Emergency Dispatcher)."
4. Completion of steps 1 – 3 will place you on the applicant list.

If you do not complete all requirements within one year following the submission of your application, you will be dropped from the applicant list. Once all admission requirements are met, you will be moved to the Candidate list, ranked by the date of completion of your final

admission criterion. Students for the next available class are selected in rank order from the Candidate list.

To be placed on the Candidate list:

1. Schedule and complete the TABE examination. A 10th grade score must be achieved prior to completion of the program in order to graduate.
2. Have an overall 2.0 GPA on high school and college transcripts.
3. Have official transcripts on file with Pensacola State College

When all the requirements in steps 1-3 have been met you will be moved to the candidate list, ranked by the date you completed the final requirement. It is from the candidate list that slots for the program are offered. You will be notified by mail and Piratemail regarding your acceptance to the program so please keep that information current. You must attend a mandatory orientation upon being offered a seat in the 911 Public Safety Telecommunicator Program.

Certification

Upon successful completion of all graduation requirements, the student will be eligible to take the Florida Public Safety Telecommunicator examination.

State law requires exam applicants to verify that they are free of physical or mental defect, alcohol or substance abuse. Once you are accepted into the program, you will complete a background check and drug screen.

A Drug Screen and Background check will be completed by all candidates accepted for the program. If information received from either the drug screen or background check indicates arrests in the past, you will be asked to schedule an appointment with the department head and the program director. Convictions and positive drug screens may prohibit your ability to attend clinical sessions and your ability to become certified as a Public Safety Telecommunicator (PST).

Convicted felon and nolo contendere: If you are a convicted felon, or plead nolo contendere, you will not be allowed to complete the 911 Emergency Dispatcher Program

Students with any questions regarding the felony rule should contact the Program Director.

Remember to keep us informed of any address changes that you put on the Health Programs application.

Upon your initial application to the college, you will be assigned a "Pirate Mail" email address. All official information from the college will be distributed by Pirate Mail.

Please remember to check your Pirate Mail frequently!
