Career Information

Mission

The mission of the EKG Technology Certificate Program is to provide quality education for students by preparing them for employment as Electrocardiograph Aides and Electrocardiography Technicians.

Program Information

The EKG Technology Vocational Certificate Program is a two semester program designed to provide students with practical and clinical skill needed to perform 12-lead EKG and recognize a cardiac emergency. The program will begin each fall semester (August) and conclude at the end of the spring semester (May).

The program consists of classroom and simulated laboratory experiences. The spring term includes a clinical rotation in hospital and medical facilities.

Program policy requires that all required courses be completed with a grade of "C" or better. Upon completion of the 17 vocational credit program, graduate will be awarded a Vocational Certificate.

Application Procedure

1. Apply to Pensacola State College; a \$30 application fee is required if you are a new student. The application can be completed on-line or at an Admissions office at any campus location. If you have attended Pensacola State in the past but it has been over a year, you will need to update your application. There is no charge for updating your application.
2. Complete a Health-Related Admissions application checking **EKG Technology** as your program choice. Mail, fax, or hand deliver to: Health Admissions Office. Health Admissions is located on the Warrington Campus, Building 3600, Room 3622. The fax number and address are on the application.
3. Request an official copy of your standard high school transcript or GED to be sent to the Pensacola State College Registrar's office.
4. Minimum of a 2.0 vocational grade point average.
5. Testing of Adult Basic Education (**TABE**); must have current scores on file.
6. To schedule the **TABE** test, please call the Testing Center on the Warrington Campus, 484-1076, Pensacola Campus, 484-1656, or Milton Campus, 484-4410. If you test below the 10th grade level, you must complete remediation and test out at 10th level before you can complete the program.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Q: What are the Educational Outcomes of the EKG Technology Vocational Certificate Program?

A: Educational outcomes are the terminal competencies expected of the program graduates. At the end of the EKG Technology Vocational Certificate Program at Pensacola State College, the graduate will be able to:

1. Perform an EKG.
2. Recognize and report a cardiac emergency.
3. Perform basic life support when indicated.
4. Assist in patient preparation for Holter & Telemetry monitoring and Stress Testing

Q: Will I need a License?

A: No license is required; however, a national credentialing exam is available and is highly recommended for employment.

Q: What Knowledge and Skills does an EKG Technician Need?

A: Skills include understanding cardiac anatomy and physiology, performing an EKG, and recognizing a cardiac emergency.

Q: What are some Typical Tasks?

- Preparing patient for EKG, holter and telemetry monitoring and stress testing
- Identifying the right patient to receive an EKG
- Attaching EKG leads to patient
- Entering patient data on the EKG machine
- Obtaining information from patients
- Conducting an EKG
- Reporting results as needed

Q: What other Occupations are Available?

- Patient Care Tech
- ER Tech

Q: What is the Degree Progression in EKG Technology?

A: The Pensacola State College EKG Technology Program is a seventeen (17)-credit vocational certificate program. Classes are held during the day.

Q: What is the Career Path in EKG Technology?

A: Graduates from the EKG Technology Program may advance in career by successfully completing an examination offered by a national EKG technician credentialing agency. They may also pursue a degree in any Health Care Program at Pensacola State College.

Q: Clinical Schedule:

A: The second term (spring) will include clinical hours at hospitals and medical facilities. Clinical hours are daytime only.

Q: What is the Estimated Cost of the EKG Technology Program?

The following are **approximate** costs for the EKG Technology program:

Please contact a Pensacola State College Admissions office if you have questions regarding residency. The legislature has the right to raise tuition and generally does so in July of each year.

Financial Aid

Vocational Grants may be available through Financial Aid on the Warrington Campus. Other financial aid, such as the Health Program Opportunity Grant, may be available to certain candidates. Eligibility requirements for such grants require that students submit the 'FAFSA' application and be considered eligible based upon need. For assistance in completing the

FAFSA, you may wish to contact the Education Opportunity Center (EDC) at 484-2357 or apply on-line at: www.fafsa.ed.gov.

Selection Process

Student enrollment in the program is limited to 25 new candidates per year. The number of students in each class is determined by the availability of space, equipment, qualified faculty and hospital and clinical facilities necessary for a meaningful education.

Program acceptance is based on selection from all qualified candidates meeting the minimum criteria on a first-completed/first-seated basis. Contact the Admissions Office for details at (850) 484-2210.

Orientation is usually held a few months before classes start and is mandatory. Upon official acceptance to the EKG Technology Program you will be required to attend the program orientation. Background check, drug screen, and a health form with appropriate immunizations are required. Please note: if you were convicted of, or pled Nolo Contendere to a felony, you may not be eligible to complete the program and be employed in health care. Please contact the program director with any questions.
