Program

The Office of Academic Affairs at Loyola University New Orleans (Loyola) and the Office of Academic Affairs at Pensacola State College (Pensacola State) have signed a 2+2 articulation agreement. This 2+2 agreement allows students that complete the courses prescribed in the following programs at Pensacola State to transfer to Loyola and lead to a Bachelor's degree in the respective programs:

Pensacola State students who complete coursework for an associate degree will be admitted as juniors in respective Loyola programs as outlined above, provided they meet Loyola's admission requirements.

The total number of credit hours required to complete bachelor's degrees at Loyola are outlined below. Students can transfer up to 60 semester hours for degree credit from Pensacola State to Loyola. This is a 2+2 agreement in which Pensacola State students will earn a bachelor's degree from Loyola after successfully completing at least 60 additional semester hours in the respective Loyola program and meeting all Loyola degree requirements. Pensacola State students will follow the requirements in the Loyola *Undergraduate Bulletin* in effect at the time they entered Pensacola State provided it is not over 10 years old and provided there was no break in enrollment of over 5 years.

In order to graduate from Loyola, students must complete at least 50% of courses at Loyola and achieve a quality point ratio of 2.5 or better in all work attempted at Pensacola State, a grade of "C" or better in all major courses at Loyola, and an overall GPA of 2.0 or better in all coursework completed.

Program Evaluation

Loyola will evaluate on a regular basis the performance of 2+2 students and other transfer students in upper level and programmatic courses and compare their performance to that of continuing Loyola students. Faculty members from Loyola and Pensacola State will meet to enhance the alignment of courses from the two programs.

Coordination of Agreement

Loyola University New Orleans and Pensacola State College agree to:

- 1. Communicate to each other changes to policies or requirements of their respective institutions that affect this Agreement;
- 2. Review the Agreement annually or earlier upon the request of either party. This review will include among other items, specific program articulation, course-by-course equivalencies, academic achievement, retention and graduation rates and transitional experience of participants;
- 3. Designate a primary contact for the respective institutions to serve as liaison for the purposes of monitoring this Agreement;
- 4. Announce this relationship on the respective institutions' websites, and other marketing venues as appropriate;
- 5. Provide accurate and timely information about the relationship to prospective students, and
- 6. Provide updated course catalogs to the other immediately upon availability.

Program Renewal

This Agreement will be renewed every five years from the date of signing and will be continued, modified, or terminated upon mutual agreement of the parties.

Terms of Agreement and Termination

- 1. This Agreement may be amended from time to time by the written agreement of the parties. These amendments may include without limitation, terms related to specific program articulation and course-by-course transfer articulations.
- 2. The Agreement is made effective on the date that both parties signed and shall continue for not more than five (5) years, unless earlier terminated as provided in the Agreement.
- 3. The Agreement may be terminated:
 - a. By mutual agreement of the parties, or
 - b. By either party upon 180 days prior written notice to the other party of an intention to terminate.

If at any time this Agreement conflicts with the policies and procedures of either institution, the Agreement becomes null and void immediately upon written notification.
