Association's basketball team; and

WHEREAS, Dan Shugart also became the play-by-play announcer for televised

games of the Pensacola Ice Pilots and later, broadcasts of the

Pensacola Blue Wahoos; and

WHEREAS, Dan Shugart was inducted into the Pensacola Sports Hall of Fame,

was cited by the Special Olympics as Florida's Broadcaster of the

Year, and in 2015 received the Southern League's Media Award; and

WHEREAS, Dan Shugart, an Outstanding Pensacola State College Pirate, has

twice earned the Associated Press Award for "Top Story in Florida."

HONORING VICKI CARSON

WHEREAS, Vicki Carson, an Arkansas native, was a pioneering multi-sport athlete and

outstanding educator who spent nearly 35 years at Pensacola State College with 25 of those years as the Head Coach for the Women's Basketball Team;

and

WHEREAS, Vicki Carson earned a bachelor's degree from the University of Arkansas

in 1975 and her master's degree from the University of Alabama in 1976;

and

WHEREAS, Vicki Carson was the first female in the state of Arkansas to receive an

athletic scholarship, a four-year starter on the Arkansas women's basketball and volleyball teams and a member of the 1974 state championship volleyball squad. She also played tennis at Arkansas and was the No. 2

singles player and on the No. 1 doubles team; and

WHEREAS, Vicki Carson led the Lady Pirates to the 1985 Florida College Athletic

Association State Championship, was named the 1985 FCAA Coach of the Year

and amassed a record of 515 wins with only 189 loses; and

WHEREAS, Vicki Carson guided the Lady Pirates to nine Panhandle Conference

Championships, 15 State Final Four appearances, a State Championship runner-up season finish and a National Tournament appearance; and

WHEREAS, Vicki Carson joined the NJCAA's 500 Win Club and has been inducted into

the Pensacola Sports Hall of Fame, the Florida Community College Activity Association Hall of Fame, the Florida Women's Basketball Hall of Fame and

the University of Arkansas at Little Rock Hall of Fame; and

WHEREAS, Vicki Carson was once recognized as having the most wins in FCAA

Women's Basketball history and was ranked No. 6 All-time by the NJCAA

for the Most Wins in Women's Basketball; and

WHEREAS, Vicki Carson mentored 50 FCAA Academic All-State Players, two Sandy

Miller FCAA Academic Award winners, 100 All-Conference players, placed 100 percent of her student-athletes in universities and had an overall 98

percent graduation rate among her players; and

WHEREAS, Vicki Carson, an Outstanding Pensacola State College Pirate, after retiring

from coaching, served as an associate professor and human performance and recreation coordinator at Pensacola State College from 2005-2015.

Championship Softball team that finished third in the nation with her

receiving All-American honors; and

WHEREAS, Brenda Peña was a vital member of the Key Ford Mustangs Women's Major

Open Softball team which won national championships in 1985 and 1987, with her receiving All-American honors in 1985, 1987 and 1988; and

WHEREAS, Brenda Peña was a member of the Nashville-based UPI Women's Major Open

Softball team which won national championships in 1992, 1993 and 1994, with her receiving two more All-American honors in 1991 and 1993; and

with her receiving two more All-American honors in 1991 and 1993; and

WHEREAS, Brenda Peña, after teaching and coaching at her high school alma mater from 1985 to 1997, joined Pensacola State College as head softball coach and

academic advisor from 1997 to 2015; and

WHEREAS, Brenda Peña, an Outstanding Pensacola State College Pirate, was the 2003

Panhandle Conference Softball Coach of the Year after leading the Lady Pirates to the 2003 Panhandle Conference Championship. Over her career,

she recorded 924 coaching wins; and

WHEREAS, Brenda Peña was a seven-time All-American and a five-time National

Champion; and

WHEREAS, Brenda Peña is an asset to her community. In 1999, she became the first

female inducted into the Pensacola North Rotary and was named a Rotarian

Paul Harris Fellow in 2001.
