# PENSACOLA STATE COLLEGE SCHOLARSHIP POLICIES

## 1. Scholarship Eligibility Policies

- a. Applicant must be a U.S. citizen or resident alien.
- b. Applicant must have a paid Application for Admission to PSC on file in the Student Records System. Students who have been attending PSC under the high school dual enrollment program must file a new admissions application upon graduation from high school and pay the application fee.
- c. Applicant is required to submit a PSC Scholarship Application.
- d. Though it is not required for every scholarship, it is highly recommended that each scholarship applicant file the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) with PSC School Code 001513. Completing the FAFSA may increase the number of scholarships for which the student could be eligible.
- e. Some scholarships require that the grade point average be based upon academic courses only. Refer to the Minimum Selection Criteria paragraph in each scholarship listing for specific information.
- f. All home educated students must provide official documentation of registration with the district for grades 11 and 12 and a home school affidavit. This documentation must be on file with the PSC Records Office.
- g. Recipients of the Academic Merit Scholarships are expected to enroll in and complete a minimum of 12 semester credit hours or 450 clock hours each term (Fall and Spring).
- h. All courses for which a recipient is enrolled must be successfully completed by the end of the regular examination period for that term. Incomplete (I) grades will not count toward the required completed 12 credits or 450 clock hours.
- i. Recipients must maintain satisfactory academic progress.
- j. Applicants who are on academic warning, probation, suspension, or suspension waiver or who have other restrictions are not eligible for a PSC scholarship (refer to Standards of Academic Progress outlined in the [College Catalog](#)).
- k. An appeal for an exception to any scholarship policy may be submitted to the Office of Financial Aid, Veteran and Military Family Service Center, and Scholarships. The appeal must be in writing with a **full explanation and documentation**. The Scholarship Coordinator will either approve or deny the appeal. If the appeal is denied, it will be forwarded to the PSC Scholarship Policy Committee for consideration at its next scheduled meeting.

- I. Any applicant with an outstanding obligation to the College is not eligible to receive a scholarship.
2. Length of Scholarships
  - a. The Presidential Scholarship, the Two Plus Two (2 + 2) University of Florida Institute of Food and Agricultural Sciences Scholarship, and the Academic Excellence Scholarship are each a two-year award (two consecutive academic years).
  - b. All other scholarships are for various periods of time, which may be up to one academic year. In some cases, the scholarships are renewable for a second year.
3. It is the applicant's responsibility to ensure that all required transcripts are submitted to the Records Office by the published deadline(s) for evaluation.

## **Academic Excellence Competition Scholarship**

<b>Award Amount</b>	\$1,800 per academic year
<b>Number of Awards</b>	One scholarship per department sponsoring a competition
<b>Length of Award</b>	Two years
<b>Enrollment Required</b>	Minimum of 12 credits each Fall and Spring term
<b>Selection Made By</b>	Academic Department
<b>Point of Contact</b>	Department Head
<b>Termination</b>	End of Spring term of second year

### **Description**

A two-year scholarship is awarded by each Academic Department or sponsor who conducts an Academic Excellence competition in the respective academic discipline, e.g., Visual Arts, Natural Sciences, or Performing Arts. Recipients may be required to major in the academic discipline or topic in which they competed.

### **Minimum Selection Criteria**

1. Candidates must be current high school seniors who will enroll in PSC in the following Fall term.
2. The selected senior must have a minimum cumulative, weighted high school grade point average of 3.0 in academic course work.
3. The selected senior must complete a PSC Scholarship Application.

### **Application Procedures**

1. Departments will determine their departmental competition, procedures, and criteria and distribute this information to the local high schools to solicit student participation.
2. After the competition is held, the Department Head will submit the names and required documentation of the selected students to the Vice President for Academic and Student Affairs Office.
3. Scholarship applicants are encouraged to submit an accurate FAFSA with PSC School Code 001513.

### **Eligibility Criteria to Maintain the Scholarship Within the Awarded Academic Year**

1. A minimum cumulative grade point average of 3.0 must be maintained throughout each academic year.
2. Recipient must enroll in and complete a minimum of 12 semester credit hours each term (Fall and Spring, each year). Courses for which a student is enrolled must be successfully completed by the end of the regular examination period for that term. Incomplete (I) grades will not count toward the 12 credits.
3. Recipients may be required to major in the academic discipline in which they competed.

<b>Length of Award</b>	Varies – up to one academic year
<b>Enrollment Required</b>	Minimum 12 credit hours or 450 clock hours each Fall and Spring term
<b>Selection Made By</b>	Academic Scholarship Awarding Committee
<b>Point of Contact</b>	Office of Financial Aid, VMFSC, and Scholarships – (850) 484-1680
<b>Termination</b>	Varies, but not later than the end of each academic year

### **Description**

A one-year scholarship is awarded to students for the Fall, Spring, and/or Summer terms, based on academic merit. Up to two terms per academic year.

### **Minimum Selection Criteria**

The applicant must have a minimum unweighted high school grade point average of 3.0 or college grade point average of 3.0.

### **Application Procedures**

1. Complete the PSC Scholarship Application and submit documents to the Office of Financial Aid, Veteran and Military Family Service Center, and Scholarships
2. Scholarship applicants are encouraged to submit an accurate FAFSA with PSC School Code 001513.

### **Eligibility Criteria to Maintain the Scholarship Within the Awarded Academic Year**

1. A minimum cumulative grade point average of 3.0 must be maintained throughout the academic year.
2. Recipients must enroll in and complete a minimum of 12 semester credit hours or 450 clock hours each term (Fall and Spring). Courses for which a student is enrolled must be successfully completed by the end of the regular examination period for that term. Incomplete (I) grades will not count toward the 12 credits or 450 clock hours.

## **Presidential Scholarship**

<b>Award Amount</b>	Varies
<b>Number of Awards</b>	Varies
<b>Length of Award</b>	Two academic years (maximum)
<b>Enrollment Required</b>	Minimum 12 credits or 450 clock hours each Fall and Spring term and a maximum of six (6) credits in the Summer term
<b>Selection Made By</b>	PSC President
<b>Point of Contact</b>	Office of Financial Aid, VMFSC, and Scholarships – (850) 484-1680

### **Description**

The Presidential Scholarship is a two-year, full-tuition and books award. The recipients of this scholarship represent some of the most exemplary student leaders on the PSC campus.

### **Minimum Selection Criteria**

1. The applicant must be a U.S. Citizen or Resident Alien.
2. The applicant must have a minimum unweighted high school grade point average of 3.2.

### **Application Procedures**

1. Complete and submit a PSC Scholarship Application.
2. The applicant must provide a minimum of one letter of recommendation. The letter of recommendation should come from the applicant's principal, teacher, employer, counselor, or pastor, etc. Recommendations should not be submitted by family members or friends.
3. Scholarship applicants are encouraged to submit the FAFSA with PSC School Code 001513.
4. The President's Office will confirm, in writing to the Office of Financial Aid, Veteran and Military Family Service Center, and Scholarships, the name of the recipient(s). The recipient(s) will be contacted by the Office of Financial Aid, Veteran and Military Family Service Center, and Scholarships to provide support in the completion of all necessary processes.

### **Eligibility Criteria to Maintain the Scholarship Within the Awarded Academic Year**

1. Recipient cannot receive a grade below a B in any course after award of this scholarship.
2. Recipient must enroll in and complete a minimum of 12 semester credit hours or 450 clock hours each term (Fall and Spring). Courses for which a student is enrolled must be successfully completed by the end of the regular examination period for that term. Incomplete (I) grades will not count toward the 12 credits or 450 clock hours.

## **Scholar Athlete Scholarship**

<b>Award Amount</b>	\$900 per term, maximum award \$1,800 per academic year
<b>Number of Awards</b>	Varies
<b>Length of Award</b>	One academic year – Fall and Spring terms (maximum)
<b>Enrollment Required</b>	Minimum 12 credits or 450 clock hours each Fall and Spring term
<b>Selection Made By</b>	Committee appointed by Pensacola Sports
<b>Point of Contact</b>	Director of Athletics – (850) 484-1304
<b>Termination</b>	End of Spring term

### **Description**

A one academic year scholarship is awarded to Escambia and Santa Rosa county high school seniors who were selected by the Pensacola Sports committee for their outstanding academic and athletic achievements.

### **Minimum Selection Criteria**

1. Student must have a minimum cumulative, weighted high school grade point average of 3.0.
2. Student must have been active in high school varsity sports and other extracurricular activities.

### **Application Procedures**

1. The high school principals and coaches make nominations in December or January each year to Pensacola Sports.
2. Pensacola Sports will forward the name of the winner in each category to the Office of Financial Aid, Veteran and Military Family Service Center, and Scholarships, who in turn will provide the winner with all the necessary information for accepting the scholarship.
3. Scholarship applicants are encouraged to submit an accurate FAFSA with PSC School Code 001513.

### **Eligibility Criteria to Maintain the Scholarship Within the Awarded Academic Year**

1. A minimum cumulative grade point average of 3.0 must be maintained throughout the academic year.
2. Recipient must enroll in and complete a minimum of 12 semester credit hours or 450 clock hours each term (Fall and Spring). Courses for which a student is enrolled must be successfully completed by the end of the regular examination period for that term. Incomplete (I) grades will not count toward the 12 credits or 450 clock hours.

## **Sophomore Scholarship**

<b>Award Amount</b>	\$900 per term, maximum award \$1,800 per academic year
<b>Number of Awards</b>	Varies
<b>Length of Award</b>	Varies – up to one academic year
<b>Enrollment Required</b>	Minimum 12 credits or 450 clock hours each Fall and Spring term
<b>Selection Made By</b>	Office of Financial Aid, VMFSC, and Scholarships
<b>Point of Contact</b>	Office of Financial Aid, VMFSC, and Scholarships – (850) 484-1680
<b>Termination</b>	Varies, but not later than the end of each academic year

### **Description**

A one-year scholarship is awarded to Sophomore students for the Fall, Spring, and/or Summer terms, based on academic merit. Up to two terms per academic year.

### **Minimum Selection Criteria**

The applicant must have a minimum cumulative grade point average of 3.0 based on 24 completed college credits or 900 clock hours at PSC. Priority consideration is given to sophomores who were awarded a PSC scholarship during their freshman year.

### **Application Procedures**

1. The applicant must complete a PSC Scholarship Application.
2. Scholarship applicants are encouraged to submit an accurate FAFSA with PSC School Code 001513.

### **Eligibility Criteria to Maintain the Scholarship Within the Awarded Academic Year**

1. A minimum cumulative grade point average of 3.0 must be maintained throughout the academic year.
2. Recipient must enroll in and complete a minimum of 12 semester credit hours or 450 clock hours each term (Fall and Spring). Courses for which a student is enrolled must be successfully completed by the end of the regular examination period for that term. Incomplete (I) grades will not count toward the 12 credits or 450 clock hours.

<b>Length of Award</b>	One academic year (30 credits maximum) renewable for a second year if selected
<b>Enrollment Required</b>	Minimum 12 credit hours or 450 clock hours each Fall and Spring term
<b>Selection Made By</b>	Appointed Committee Members
<b>Point of Contact</b>	Director of Admissions – (850) 471-4680

### **Description**

Ambassadors will be selected for their demonstrations of leadership, achievement, and community involvement and will serve as the official hosts and hostesses of PSC. The students will represent the College at campus visits and tours, commencements, alumni and Foundation activities, and general recruiting initiatives.

### **Minimum Selection Criteria**

1. The applicant must be a U.S. Citizen or Resident Alien.
2. The applicant must be a current high school senior graduating this spring term and entering college in the following fall term.
3. The applicant must have a minimum unweighted high school grade point average of 3.0.

### **Application Procedures**

1. The applicant must complete a PSC Scholarship Application.
2. Applicant must provide a minimum of one letter of recommendation. Letters of recommendation should come from the applicant's principal, teacher, employer, counselor, pastor, etc. Recommendations should not be submitted by family members or friends.
3. If selected as a finalist, the applicant must participate in an interview.
4. Scholarship applicants are encouraged to submit an accurate FAFSA with PSC School Code 001513.

### **Eligibility Criteria to Maintain the Scholarship Within the Awarded Academic Year**

1. Recipient must maintain a 3.0 grade point average each semester.
2. Recipient must enroll in and complete a minimum of 12 semester credits each term (Fall and Spring). Courses for which a student is enrolled must be successfully completed by the end of the regular examination period for that term. Incomplete (I) grades will not count toward the 12 credits.

## Two Plus Two (2+2) University of Florida | Institute of Food and Agricultural Science Scholarship

<b>Award Amount</b>	\$900 per term, maximum award \$1,800 per academic year
<b>Number of Awards</b>	Maximum three awards per academic year
<b>Length of Award</b>	Two academic years, maximum
<b>Enrollment Required</b>	Minimum 12 credits each Fall and Spring terms
<b>Selection Made By</b>	Dean, Milton Campus and Appointed Committee Members
<b>Point of Contact</b>	Dean, Milton Campus – (850) 484-4443

### Description

A Two Plus Two (2 + 2) scholarship enables high school students from Escambia and Santa Rosa counties to receive a two-year scholarship to attend PSC and a two-year scholarship to the University of Florida | Institute of Food and Agricultural Sciences.

### Minimum Selection Criteria

The applicant must have an overall minimum cumulative, unweighted high school 3.0 grade point average based on academic courses, such as English and Foreign Languages, History, Mathematics, Science, and similar courses. Vocational and non-vocational subjects, such as driver's education, business co-op training, and sports are not considered in the final grade point average.

### Application Procedures

1. The applicant must complete a PSC Scholarship Application.
2. Scholarship applicants are encouraged to submit an accurate FAFSA with PSC School Code 001513.

### Eligibility Criteria to Maintain the Scholarship Within the Awarded Academic Year

1. A minimum cumulative grade point average of 3.0 must be maintained throughout each academic year.
2. All agricultural sciences majors are required to have completed one algebra and one trigonometry course. Students must have completed most of the pre-professional courses listed in the University of Florida Transfer Advisement Manual.

### Minimum Selection Criteria

As determined by the Vice President, based on recommendations from faculty, staff, and members of the community. Most students will meet statutory guidelines for financial need.

### Application Procedures

1. The applicant must complete a PSC Scholarship Application.
2. Scholarship applicants are encouraged to submit an accurate FAFSA with PSC School Code 001513.

### Eligibility Criteria to Maintain the Scholarship Within the Awarded Academic Year

At the discretion of the Vice President, Academic and Student Affairs.

## Dean, Milton Campus Scholarship

<b>Award Amount</b>	Varies
<b>Number of Awards</b>	Varies
<b>Length of Award</b>	One term
<b>Selection Made By</b>	Dean, Milton Campus
<b>Point of Contact</b>	Dean, Milton Campus – (850) 484-4443

### Description

This scholarship is awarded for one term at a time and is designed primarily for students in need of financial assistance. Students can be enrolled on a full or part-time basis.

### Minimum Selection Criteria

As determined by the Dean, Milton Campus, based on recommendations from faculty, staff, and members of the community. Most students will meet statutory guidelines for financial need.

### Application Procedures

1. The applicant must complete a PSC Scholarship Application.
2. Scholarship applicants are encouraged to submit an accurate FAFSA with PSC School Code 001513.

### Eligibility Criteria to Maintain the Scholarship Within the Awarded Academic Year

At the discretion of the Dean, Milton Campus.

## Dean, Warrington Campus Scholarship

<b>Award Amount</b>	Varies
<b>Number of Awards</b>	Varies
<b>Length of Award</b>	Up to one academic year, maximum
<b>Selection Made By</b>	Dean, Warrington Campus
<b>Point of Contact</b>	Dean, Warrington Campus – (850) 484-2230

### Description

This scholarship is generally awarded one term at a time, at the Dean’s discretion, to a student enrolled full or part time on the Warrington campus who does not qualify for or has not received sufficient financial assistance to meet educational expenses. Grade point average is considered.

### Minimum Selection Criteria

As determined by the Dean, Warrington Campus, based on recommendations from the PSC faculty and staff members or the community. Most students will meet statutory guidelines for financial need.

### Application Procedures

1. The applicant must complete a PSC Scholarship Application.

2. The applicant must complete a PSC Scholarship Application.
3. Scholarship applicants are encouraged to submit an accurate FAFSA with PSC School Code 001513.
