



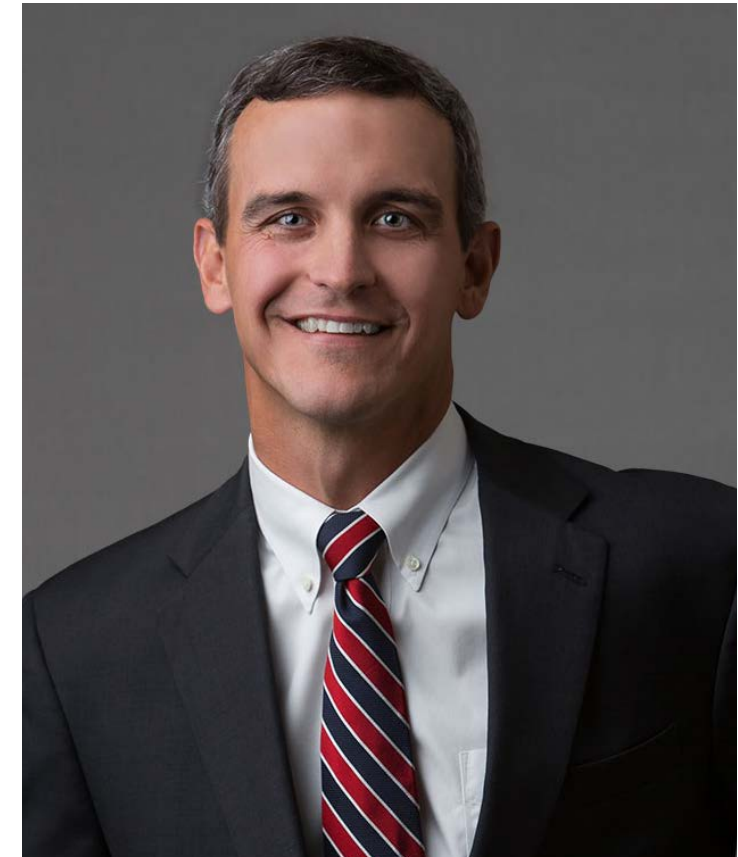

The Foundation holds 173 Endowed Scholarships, which equate to \$8,973,239. Ron and Dale Hensley are our most recent scholarship donors.

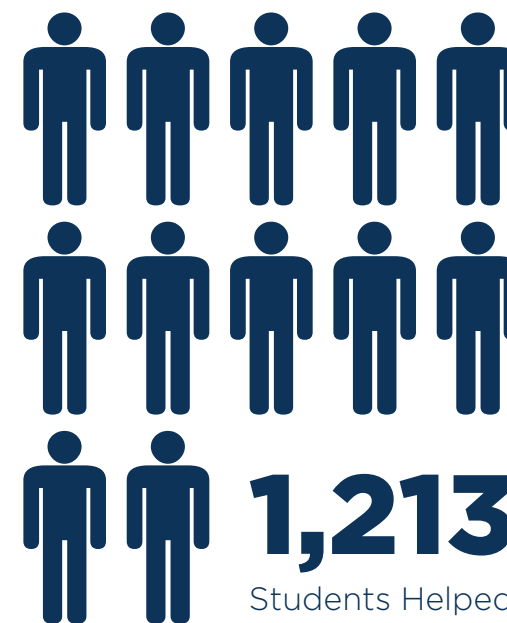
Several years ago, we had a foster child and lost contact with her after she aged out of the program. After 12 years, we found out she was in jail and was being released to a halfway house. We reconnected with her and discovered

that people being released back into society from prison had nowhere to stay and that job opportunities were sparse. We were able to help her get a job and eventually rent a house.

This got us to thinking about others in her situation. We have been sponsoring a scholarship for single working moms in Tennessee. We had so much success with that program that we thought we would try it again at PSC, this time with people recently released from prison who desire to improve their situation in life. We are proud to sponsor the "Next Step" scholarship and hope it is the beginning of a long relationship with PSC.

A Simple Act of Giving Creates Opportunities

Programmatic support is key to the success of Pensacola State College. Community members and staff generously support the varied interests of our student body by volunteering and contributing to specific program areas. Donors support one (or sometimes all) of PSC's affinity groups, which include athletics, visual arts, performing arts, culinary and hospitality management. Legacy gift donors are also very important to PSC's long-term financial stability.



Top Three Scholarships Awarded

Theresa Gail May Scholarship \$78,636.06 Awarded | Helped 80 Students

The Theresa Gail May Scholarship provides up to \$4,000 in each annual award, the Theresa Gail May Scholarship is available to Santa Rosa residents. Recipients must have a minimum 2.5 grade point average and be enrolled full-time or part-time. The scholarship is open to seniors graduating from Central, Jay, Milton, Pace, Santa Rosa Adult High Schools, and Locklin Technical Center. In addition to a demonstrated financial need, recipients should possess leadership qualities through high school involvement or in the community. Funds cover tuition, fees, and/or books.

Universal Scholarship Fund \$60,095.65 Awarded | Helped 283 Students

The Universal Scholarship Fund provides up to \$1,500 in each annual award. Students must demonstrate financial need and be in good academic standing with a minimum 2.0 grade point average upon enrollment at PSC. Recipients must be a U.S. citizen or resident alien. The scholarship will cover tuition, registration fees, and/or books.

Chadbourne Foundation Endowed Scholarship \$60,095.65 Awarded | Helped 283 Students

The Chadbourne Foundation Endowed Scholarship is awarded to a deserving student enrolled in A.S., A.A., Vocational Technical, BAS or BSN programs at Pensacola State. The scholarship award amount varies, but a student must demonstrate financial need. The eligible student must have and maintain a minimum 2.5 grade point average, and be an Escambia or Santa Rosa County resident. Scholarship funds may be used for tuition, fees, books, and/or supplies.

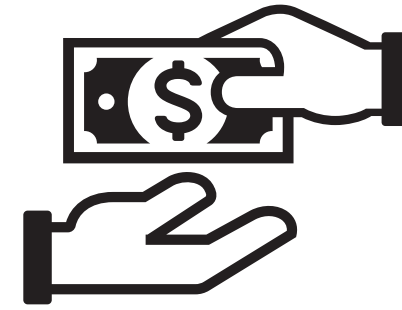

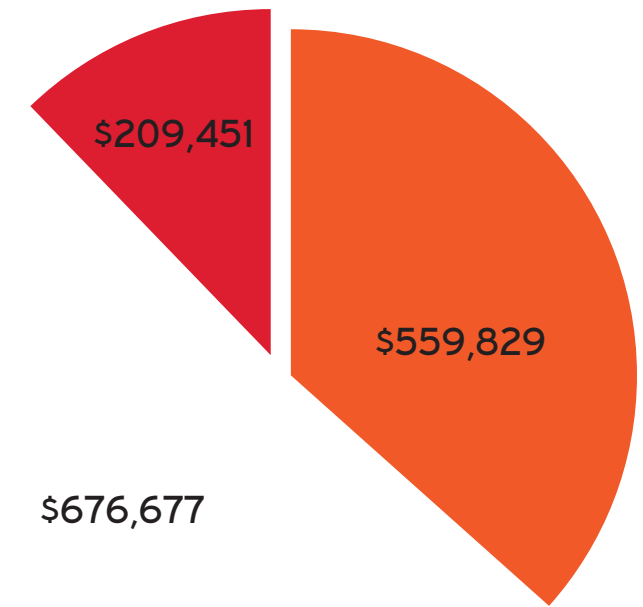




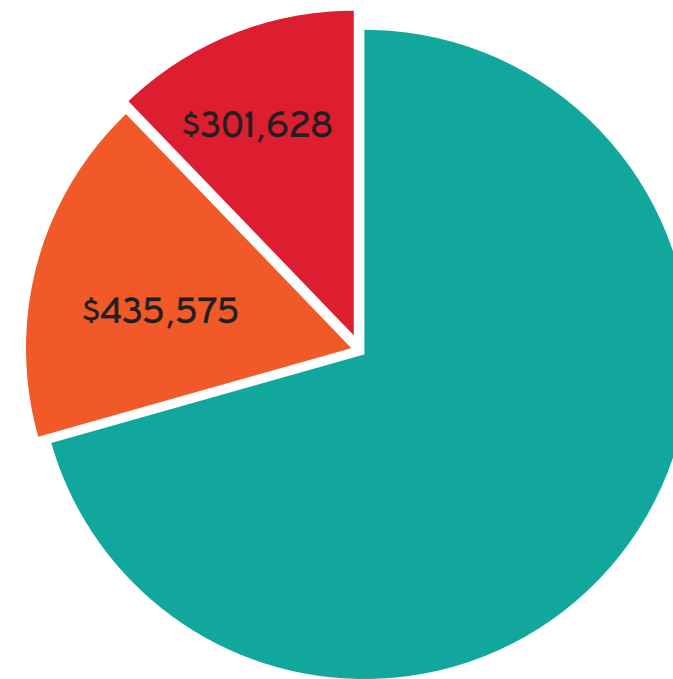
2017 Overview

Due to generous support from donors and the community at large, the Pensacola State College Foundation ended 2017 with Total Assets of \$25,697,819. The Foundation's Liabilities and Net Position is the same with the bulk of the Liabilities in the form of \$14M as expendable and just over \$10M in nonexpendable forms like restricted endowments.

2017 Operating Revenue



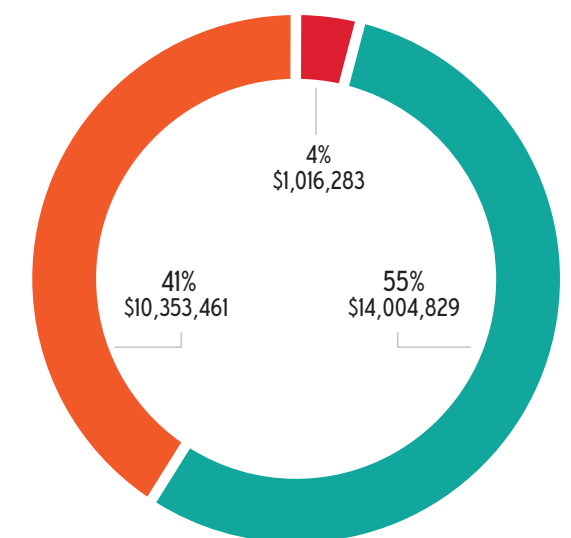
2017 Operating Expenses
