Donors stepped up for our students by establishing *16 new scholarships* at the PSC Foundation! Of the new scholarships, *2* are immediately available for award, and *14* are endowed and will benefit students in perpetuity.

Generous donors helped provide *\$895,415.00* in scholarship awards in 2022. This support made a difference in the lives of *1,066 students* and their families.

These 16 new scholarships bring the number of privately-funded scholarships to *311* and will increase access to education moving forward.

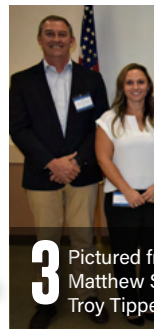

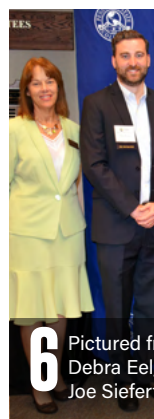

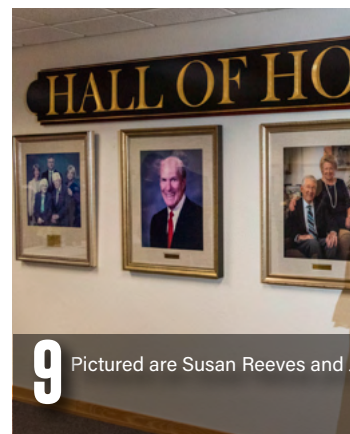

1 BEAR, JONES, MOORE, AND REEVES CENTER FOR MATH AND ADVANCED TECHNOLOGY GROUNDBREAKING

On June 8, ground was broken on Phase II of PSC's STEM facility — the Bear, Jones, Moore, and Reeves Center for Math and Advanced Technology. Construction on the 46,133-square-foot facility, estimated to cost \$22 million to \$25 million, began in January, 2022, with estimated completion by December 2023.

2 MOLLY MCGUIRE CULINARY ARTS DINING ROOM SCHOLARSHIP MILESTONE

A \$32,000 donation from the Irish Politicians Club and the McGuire Martin family has grown the principal of the Molly McGuire Culinary Arts Endowed Scholarship to over \$500,000. Celebrating this announcement, family and friends gathered on October 5 in the PSC Molly McGuire Culinary Arts Dining Room.

3 ASCEND PERFORMANCE MATERIALS SPECIAL ANNOUNCEMENT

Ascend Performance Materials presented Pensacola State College with a \$50,000 check in support of the Ascend-Monsanto-Solutia Endowed Scholarship. Former students, now employed by Ascend, gathered with Monsanto-Solutia Retirees and PSC leadership to celebrate the September 12 announcement that the endowment principal had now reached \$100,000.

4 BEAR, JONES, MOORE, REEVES CENTER FOR MATH AND ADVANCED TECHNOLOGY

On March 1, the Bear, Jones, Moore, and Reeves Center for Math and Advanced Technology was named to honor four Pensacola families that collectively donated \$1 million to fund STEM-related scholarships at the College. In appreciation, PSC's Board of Trustees voted to name Phase II of the new STEM building.

5 ELDON L. NORMAN EDUCATIONAL OPPORTUNITY CENTER

On April 11, the PSC Eldon L. Norman Educational Opportunity Center was named to honor the late alumni who earned his Associate of Arts degree in 1963 at then PJC. Jean Norman, his wife, established the Eldon L. Norman Memorial Endowed Scholarship in 2002, whose principal reached \$100,735 with her recent donation of \$25,000.

6 SIEFERT HIGHPOINTE GIFT ANNOUNCEMENT

On July 19, the College celebrated the generosity of Sharen Siefert and the Highpointe Hotel Corporation. The Sharen Siefert Memorial Endowed Scholarship was established with a \$120,000 donation from the late Siefert while Highpointe, and four of its properties, committed \$50,000 to the proposed PSC Training and Conference Center.

7 FLORIDA POWER & LIGHT COMPANY NONPROFIT CENTER TRAINING ROOM

The Florida Power & Light Company Nonprofit Center Training Room was dedicated on November 15, in appreciation of the company's 55 years of support for the College and that includes a five-year commitment of \$150,000 to start the Nonprofit Center for Excellence. Since 2019, the Center has hosted over 37 trainings with over 550 attendees.

8 TIPPETT FAMILY ENDOWED TEACHING CHAIR

In 2022, PSC Board of Trustees Chair Dr. Troy Tippet and his wife, Diane, established an endowed teaching chair with a \$100,000 donation. This chair will benefit a faculty member in the science, technology, or mathematics field, paying homage to Dr. Tippet's career as medical director for the Neurosurgical Group of Pensacola and his association with several medical and neurological organizations and foundations.

9 JIM REEVES INDUCTED AS A FOUNDATION FELLOW

Jim Reeves was named a PSC Foundation Fellow on June 27, in honor and appreciation of his support for the College. A Foundation Governor, Reeves has donated over \$260,000 to PSC and most recently established an endowed scholarship. This honorary title is bestowed to families and individuals who have worked to strengthen PSC through influence and significant financial contributions.

In 2022, \$30K was used to draw in another \$30K needed to create 3 new privately-endowed scholarships. \$27,295 helped secure \$54,590 in State matching dollars. \$17,506 helped secure \$17,506 in matching private grant dollars.

Athletics and Athletic Boosters

PSC provides invaluable support for all student athletes. Every gift has a positive impact on their ability to succeed in the classroom, in competitions, and in the community. Thanks to the generosity its donors, the PSC Foundation received \$135,619 in donations to their Athletics Program. The coaches, volunteers, and staff leaders associated with PSC Athletics were able to raise over \$99,000 for the overall Game Plan Athletics Campaign with the 2022 Pars for Pirates Golf Tournament raising another \$16,510 for their programs. PSC's Affinity Group, Athletics Boosters, helps support student athletes with gifts and service that provide access to updated equipment, facilities, and more.

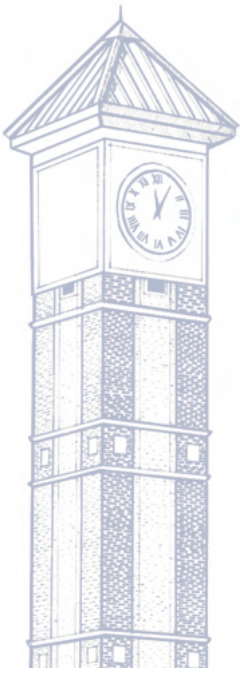
