If a citation runs more than one line, double space and use a **hanging indent format** in the list of **References**.*

### **eBooks:**

Author's last name, first initial(s). (Year of publication.) *Title of the book (in italics)*. (Edition if later than the first). Place of publication: Publisher. Retrieved from name of database or URL of publisher's homepage.

(Ed.) *Title of the Anthology/Collection (in italics)*. (pp. page numbers). Edition (if later than the first). City of Publication: Publisher. Retrieved from URL of publisher's homepage.

***List the first seven authors or editors of a work as follows: Last name, first initials. Use the same sequence as provided in the work to be cited. Separate the authors' names with a comma, using an ampersand (&) between the name of the next-to-last author and the last author. If there are more than seven authors, list the six names, insert a comma, and then insert an ellipsis (...) and the last author's name.***
