Career and Technical Education Student Resources (CTE)

CTE provides services like textbook loans, scholarships, career advising, and résumé help to students enrolled in Associate in Science (A.S.) degree programs, Vocational Certificate (Clock Hour) programs, or College Credit Certificate programs.

Computer Labs

PSC offers open lab spaces on all campuses and at all sites for students. Go see them if you need to use a computer or want friendly support with computer problems or software questions.

Health Sciences Learning Center

Located on the Warrington campus, the Health Sciences Learning Center supports students enrolled in a health science program.

Library

At PSC, our libraries can help you reach all your academic goals and have fun as well. We have books in print and electronic formats; newspapers from all over; magazines, trade publications, and journals; and DVDs. We also offer you access to research databases, e-books, and e-videos.

Math Labs

If you're enrolled in a math class, visit the Math Lab on any campus for free walk-in help. There you'll find a comfortable, supportive environment. Our tutors want to help you be successful. If you can't get to a physical Math Lab on one of our campuses, take advantage of high-quality assistance via Virtual Math Tutoring.

TRIO | Student Support Services

If your parents do not have a bachelor's degree, you have a low income, or you have a disability, TRIO-Student Support Services will help you achieve success. You will have access to one-on-one tutoring and your very own Academic Advisor/Life Skills Coach. Your Coach can work with you on anything you need help with, including class schedules or degree plans. Your Coach can also help you with career choices, financial aid, transferring to a university, and any social or personal issue that impacts your college success.

TRIO | Educational Talent Search

Educational Talent Search provides numerous services to help eligible middle and high school students be better prepared for college. Services include activities such as tutoring, academic counseling, career exploration, SAT/ACT test preparation, college tours, postsecondary program information, and workshops.

Virtual Tutoring Labs

The Virtual Tutoring Labs provide you with access to live tutors in a fully interactive, virtual online environment. You may speak, email, or chat with the virtual tutor and get the help you need. Tutors work through your assignments with you, prompting you to answer questions and interact throughout the process. Virtual Tutors are available to assist you after business hours and on weekends.

Writing Labs

The Writing Labs provide drop-in assistance with all college writing assignments. Tutors can review a paper you have already written, help you develop ideas for a paper you are working on, or show you how to cite sources the right way. Grammar workshops and practice resources are available as well. On-site computers and printers are available in each lab for student use. If you can't get to a physical Writing Lab on one of our campuses, you may take advantage of high-quality assistance via Virtual Writing Tutoring or email your paper to writinglab@pensacolastate.edu. Allow 24-48 hours for email feedback.

MANAGING A DISABILITY

ADA Services and Resources

PSC Alert

PSC Alert is an Emergency Mass Notification System that warns students, faculty, and staff about important or dangerous situations using text message, voice message, and personal email. It is highly recommended to register for this feature to stay current on any emergency notifications.

Public Safety (Police)

The PSC Public Safety Department aims to keep everyone on any of the PSC campuses or sites safe. The police also provide parking decals, car start and key assistance, escorts, safety tips, and more.

Pirates CARE Student Resource Center

The Pirates CARE Student Resource Center helps students connect with on and off campus resources to support them with challenges they may face outside the classroom that affects how they are doing in school. Pirate Food Pantry

STUDENT TECHNOLOGY

Accounts and Passwords

All PSC students are given several accounts and passwords soon after they apply and are accepted. PSC is committed to online security and the credentials provided to you are unique. It is important that you memorize this information and not share it with anyone.

Canvas

All eLearning courses (distance learning and hybrid) are delivered through PSC's online course delivery system called Canvas. Many instructors teaching on-campus use Canvas as well. It's secure, easy to use, and helps store and organize your PSC course materials.

If you are having trouble with your Canvas password, you may contact the Help Desk for assistance. For issues related to your course, please contact your instructor. For all other Canvas related issues, please call their Technical Support at 855-534-1843.

PirateMail

PirateMail is PSC's official email system. All students receive a PirateMail account when they apply and are accepted. In addition to email, PirateMail allows users to make appointments, organize tasks, and send files. PirateMail should be checked often.

Workday Student

Workday Student is PSC's Student Information System. PSC students use Workday Student to register for courses, view their schedules, grades, and holds, check degree progress, add/drop courses, pay fees, apply for graduation, and much more!

TechHelp

The Technology Support Portal provides a comprehensive suite of self help tools, including Workday instructions, password reset, and student MFA reset, which empower users to resolve many issues independently.
