Course Description: This is a study of fundamental statistical methods including organization, analysis and interpretation of numerical data, measures of central tendency and dispersion, statistical distributions, sampling techniques, hypothesis testing, probability, z-tests, chi-square tests, correlations, and regression equations. Online Course: This is a hybrid course. Instruction and tests will be in-class, and homework will be online.
