Course Policies:

1. This class will be conducted under the regulations defined in the Code of Student Conduct in the Pensacola State College Catalog.

2. Attendance:

Regular attendance is required. Quizzes, discussions, and exams will not be accessible after the deadline has passed. Papers must be submitted on time. If a paper is late, points will be deducted for each day it is late. If a paper is not submitted within one week of the due date, you will receive a zero. Standards for written work: All papers must adhere to MLA formatting requirements. All papers must be in MLA format (12 point standard font; one inch margins throughout) and be submitted in DOC, DOCX, or PDF format. No others will be accepted.

Turnitin: When you submit your writing assignments to the Canvas drop box, they will automatically be submitted to Turnitin. Some of you might be familiar with this program. Turnitin is used as a plagiarism checker. Although it is often used to identify plagiarism after the fact, I prefer to use Turnitin as a teaching tool. If you submit drafts of your papers BEFORE they are due, you will have the opportunity to revise areas of your paper where you might be unintentionally plagiarizing sources and/or not citing them correctly.

Cheating and Plagiarism Policy: Plagiarism is the use of anyone else's ideas or words without giving proper credit. Cheating includes, among other things, copying someone else's work, turning in work done by someone else, or turning in work that has been submitted in another class by you or anyone else.
