JANUARY 1ST

New Year's Day, January 1, has been a federal holiday in the United States since 1870. Schools and most businesses are not open. Families and friends may have meals together. Certain foods are eaten for good luck: pork, as pigs are said to represent plenty and moving forward; black eyed-peas, included in dishes such as Hoppin' John, a southern dish, because the roundness of the peas stands for a complete year and money; cabbage, which also means prosperity.

RATIFICATION DAY JANUARY 14TH

Ratification Day on January 14th annually recognizes the act that officially ended the American Revolution. The day commemorates the ratification of the Treaty of Paris on January 14, 1784, at the Maryland State House in Annapolis, Maryland, by the Confederation Congress.

After the Declaration of Independence was signed, nearly eight years passed before the British and the Americans agreed to a cease-fire. As part of the Treaty of Paris, Great Britain recognized the United States as a sovereign entity.

It is the most enduring premise of the treaty. The treaty also defined boundaries, specifically the Northwest Territory, which included Ohio and the rich prairie land of Indiana and Illinois. The treaty also included Michigan, Wisconsin, and parts of Minnesota . Several of the nation's founding fathers negotiated the peace treaty, including John Adams, John Jay, and Benjamin Franklin.



MARTIN LUTHER KING JR. DAY JANUARY 16TH

On the third Monday in January, Martin Luther King Jr Day honors the American clergyman, activist, Civil Rights Movement leader. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. (January 15, 1929 – April 4, 1968) is best known for his role in advancing civil rights using nonviolent civil disobedience. King has become a national icon in the history of American progressivism.

NATIONAL PENGUIN DAY JANUARY 20TH

We love penguins for lots of reasons: They walk around in tuxedos, they have a cute waddle, and they're unique! And to show that we care, we observe National Penguin Day on January 20. While this day celebrates the penguins, it's also a time to think about saving them. Many penguin colonies have been lost to climate change and it's estimated that half the population of emperor penguins will vanish by the end of this century. We can start to help these endangered creatures by focusing on environmental issues.

CHINESE LUNAR NEW YEAR JANUARY 22ND

Chinese Lunar New Year's Day is celebrated every year on the first day of the traditional lunisolar Chinese calendar, typically occurring between January 21 and February 20. This year, it falls on January 22. It is also commonly referred to as Lunar New Year or Spring Festival. Celebrations last for 15 days, seven of which are work-free. During this fun period, families get together, cash gifts are handed to young people, and homes are thoroughly cleaned to usher in fresh blessings for the new year.

NATIONAL FLORIDA DAY JANUARY 25TH

National Florida Day on January 25th recognizes the 27th state to join the United States. The Sunshine State is home to the oldest established city in the country. With over 400 years of history, St. Augustine's streets and colonial architecture have stories to tell. It was founded by Spanish explorers in 1565. East and West Florida became the 14th and 15th British Colonies after the end of the French and Indian War in 1763. However, in 1783, after the end of the American Revolutionary War, The Treaty of Paris returned Florida to Spain.

The 27th was chosen as it marks the anniversary of the date when, in 1945, Soviet troops liberated Auschwitz-Birkenau, the largest concentration camp operated by the Nazis.

As the new semester starts, new students who are veterans need to remember if they desire to use their VA benefits to pay for college, they need to make sure to check in with the PSC Veteran's Service Office (VSO) in building 6 on the Pensacola campus. In order for a veteran student to have the VA pay for their classes and provide other financial support, the VSO needs a letter of eligibility from the VA and complete some intake paperwork.
