What is the TRIO Educational Opportunity Center (EOC)?

TRIO EOC is a grant program designed to assist low to moderate income individuals and or those that are first-generation students enter a college, university, or technical school of their choice.

We look forward to assisting clients you send our way! Or, if you are interested in our services, please contact us.

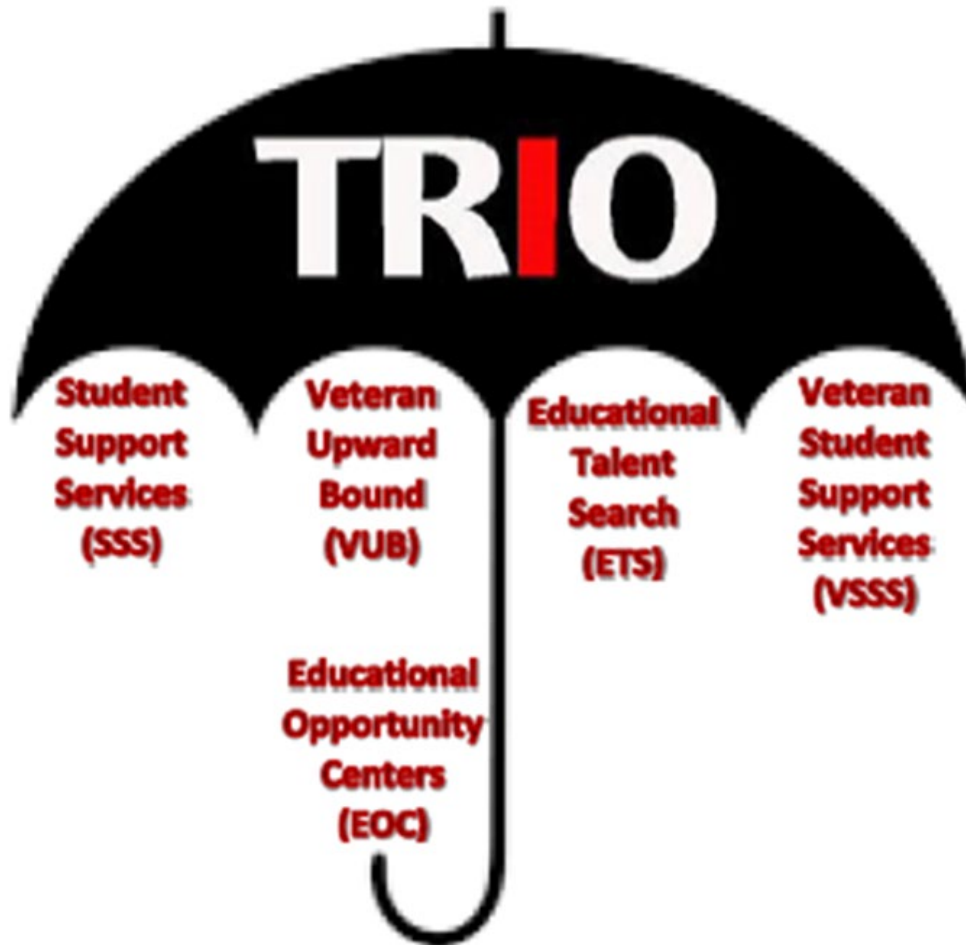

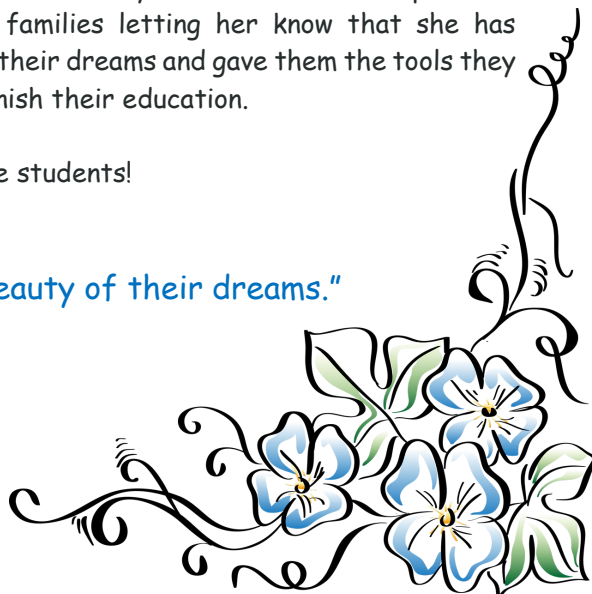

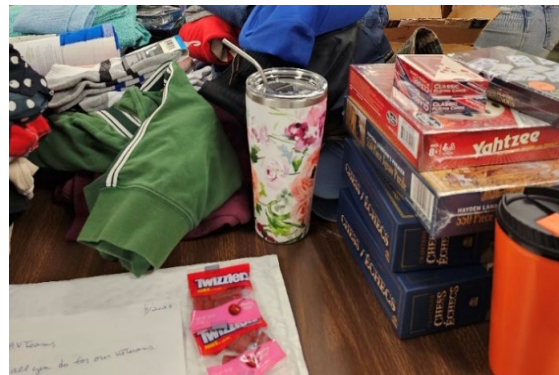


Milton Campus

The FREE FAFSA workshops, administered by the PSC's Financial Aid Department and TRIO EOC have been a successful alternative for individuals that need assistance with their financial aid application but needed help outside of normal business hours. At these workshops, students were assisted on a first-come, first-serve basis - no appointment required. Services offered included step-by-step assistance with the FAFSA completion, assistance with the admissions application, and general assistance with the enrollment process. These workshops have been held on a monthly basis, starting in February 2023 and going thru June 2023. The TRIO EOC assisted over 30 countable students with FREE services throughout these workshops.

FAFSA Completions for the 2023-2024 Cycle



The FAFSA Challenge encourages each school and district in the state of Florida to increase their FAFSA completion percentage by at least 5% the previous cycle. <https://floridacollegeaccess.org>

The TRIO Educational Opportunity Center Specialists assisted with achieving this goal by collaborating with their assigned high school to plan and attend FAFSA events. Specialists give an overview of EOC services, assist students with the financial aid application (FAFSA) process, assist with the admissions application to the school of their choice, and give general guidance on other grants and scholarships that may be available to the student.
